### **Sokol Minnesota's Annual**

#### **Easter Bake Sale and Pancake Breakfast**

**Palm Sunday, March 16, 11 a.m. – 2 p.m.**

in the grand second-floor auditorium of the historic C.S.P.S. Hall, 383 Michigan Street, St. Paul.

Guests will enjoy all-you-can-eat pancakes, complimented with sausages, juice, plus coffee or milk.

\$6 for adults and \$3 for children under age 8.

Traditional Czech Easter bread called páska, favorite spring perníčky (gingerbread cookies), lamb-shaped cakes, and Sokol Minnesota's own famous Kolache (prune, poppy seed, cream cheese, cherry, or apricot filled sweet rolls) and Houska (lightly-spiced holiday yeast bread braided in a circle) will be sold.

Also for sale will be filled Easter baskets, complete with candy and treats just right for the Easter Bunny to hide at your house.

A large "Easter food basket" filled with ham, wine, and other typical Easter delicacies, typical of a traditional basket of food that the village priest would have blessed for Easter, will be part of a Silent Auction.

Come hungry, enjoy breakfast, and take home baked goods and other spring fancies for your own Easter celebration.

The historic C.S.P.S. (Česko-Slovanský Podporující Spolek) Hall is located at 383 Michigan Street in Saint Paul, just off West 7<sup>th</sup> (a.k.a. Old Fort Road) near downtown St. Paul. It has been Sokol Minnesota's home since its construction in 1887. It was declared a National and State Historic Site in 1977. It is the longest serving Czech-Slovak cultural center in the United States.

Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota is a social, cultural, educational and gymnastic organization, which seeks to preserve and transmit the vitality of Czech, Slovak, and immigrant heritage to future generations.
