Sokol Minnesota's Flavors of Slovakia Dinner

Enjoy a Sunday dinner like it used to be with extended family and friends, everyone sitting down together around the big table. The Flavors of Slovakia dinner is Sunday, March 30 at the historic CSPS Sokol Hall, 383 Michigan Avenue in St. Paul's West End. The public is welcome.

Sokol's renowned cooks will prepare traditional Slovak dishes, including holupky (cabbage roll), halusky kapusta (dumplings and cabbage), pirohy (which resemble large ravioli with a fruit filling), pickled beets, green beans, caraway rye bread, dessert and coffee. Take-outs are available.

Seating is limited, pre-paid reservations are necessary. \$12 for adults; \$5 for children under 7. Dinner will be served at 12:30.

The historic C.S.P.S. (Česko-Slovanský Podporující Spolek) Hall is located at 383 Michigan Street in Saint Paul, just off West 7th (a.k.a. Old Fort Road) near downtown St. Paul. It has been Sokol Minnesota's home since its construction in 1887. It was declared a National and State Historic Site in 1977. It is the longest serving Czech-Slovak cultural center in the United States.
