Prezidentův komentář/President's Notes By Judy Aubrecht

Pozdrav bratři a sestry / Greetings Brothers and Sisters

2016 has been an exciting and challenging year for Sokol Minnesota. In addition to hosting our regular cultural, fitness, and educational events, which included dinners, breakfasts, festivals, and gymnastics, dance, and language classes, we were honored in April to host a first-ever visit by a Czech Prime Minister to C.S.P.S. Hall. If you were able to attend the event, you remember the excitement building as we waited for our honored guest, the Czech Prime Minister Bohuslav Sobotka and his large entourage, including the Czech Ambassador Petr Gandalovič. Our hall looked lovely and was filled to capacity with diplomats, Sokol members, Czech and Slovak state queens, local dignitaries, community members, and guests who made the trip from near and far. Thanks to the efforts of many, the visit was a huge success and a highlight of the year.

June 2016 heralded another important event: the installation and usage of the much-anticipated air conditioning system, just in time for the annual Children's Cultural Day Camp. Fundraising for the air conditioning system took place over many years and included several matching grants. Your contributions to this important project really made a difference. Unfortunately, a recent theft of roughly ten feet of copper pipe from the outside of the building prompted the coolant in the system to drain out, and requires expensive replacement. The value of the scrap copper was under \$10, but our insurance deductible is \$1,000. And it is even more costly with the bill for damages. The bill was referred to our insurance agent, and it is expected that the air conditioning system will be working again in time for spring. Please remember Sokol Minnesota when you make your end-of-the-year charitable donations. Our major expense is the new fire escape, which the City of Saint Paul requires due to safety concerns.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to everyone who volunteered at a Sokol event or contributed to the success of our organization in other ways. I am also very grateful to the members of the Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota boards and committees, whose hard work and enthusiasm keep things running efficiently. All of your efforts truly make a difference for our organization.

Looking ahead to 2017, our annual Sokol Holiday party for adults takes place at the C.S.P.S. Hall on Sunday, January 8, beginning at 4:00 p.m. The 14th Annual Candlelight Duck Dinner is on Saturday, January 21 at 5 p.m. Seating is limited, so be sure to make your reservation soon.

Did you know that the November 2016 *Mpls St. Paul* magazine in its list of "Where to Eat Next in 2017" included the Pajarito restaurant, our new tenant? I was recently invited to tour the new Pajarito restaurant, and was very impressed with its bright, fresh look that includes murals, Mexican tiles, and a spacious, open floor plan. You are invited to perform with Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota at a Slet (gathering) of Sokols from across the United States, the Czech Republic, and Canada in a prostná (a calisthenics number) in June in Cedar Rapids. Sokol Minnesota will teach the *prostná* starting in early 2017, dates and times to be determined based on Hall and participant availability. The *prostná* we are teaching is for adults of all ages and all abilities.

The national Sokol Slet, which is a gymnast and sports competition, culminates in a grand performance on the afternoon of Sunday, June 25, with hundreds of Sokols on the field. It is a spectacular sight!

Participation in *prostná* at the *Slet* requires an official American Sokol "parade uniform" that consists of shorts, shirt, white tennis shoes, and white socks. The official uniform white shirt and blue shorts must be ordered by February 1, cost is approximately \$60, prices vary by sizes. Estimated cost of white tennis shoes and white socks, purchased on your own, is about \$45.

We Go On: Film Review by Christy Banks

Film with a Czech Connection: We Go On

2015 (90 min.) Directors: Andy Mitton, Jesse Holland.

AMC has purchased the rights to the film, and intends to release it

in January; DVDs and Blu-Ray available in March.

The independent film We Go On, a supernatural thriller, was featured at the Twin Cities Film Festival in October. Although suspenseful, the film also considers serious issues such as life after death, and whether or not existence has meaning. The plot centers on Miles Grissom (Clark Freeman), a video editor living a stunted existence because of an intense fear of his mortality caused by his father's violent accidental death years earlier. After Miles places an advertisement offering \$30,000 to anyone who can show him genuine proof of the hereafter such as ghosts or past-life memory, he tests the most likely among many clearly fraudulent responses. Assuming he'll be easy prey for swindlers, his anxious mother Charlotte (Annette O'Toole) tags along, alternately glowering at the "spiritualists," and crabbily lecturing Miles on the futility of his quest. "When you're dead, that's it!" she snaps. She is right, at least, in that Miles should be careful about what he wishes for. His ad elicits one uncanny reply that leads him into a gruesome encounter that he's unable to put behind him. How Miles chooses to respond finally determines his fate.

With engaging acting, compelling story, and skilled production, We Go On was an audience favorite at the Twin Cities Film Fest and at other festivals around the country.

It won in the Audience Award/Competition Feature category at the 2016 Dances with Films festival in Los Angeles and was nominated for Best American Independent Feature Film at the 2016 Cleveland International Film Festival. Previously, Clark Freeman has appeared in NCIS: New Orleans (2014) and Beverly Hills Chihuahua 2 (2011).

Czech Connection: Clark Freeman is the son of Lee Freeman, an attorney, who is also the Czech Honorary Consul for Montana, Wyoming, and Idaho, with the Consulate in Livingston, Montana. Lee supported many Czech artists during the period of Communist repression in Czechoslovakia (1964-1985) by smuggling their works out of the country. He donated representative paintings of many of the artists from his collection to the National Czech and Slovak Museum & Library in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

Charles Jonas: Outstanding Czech-American BOOK REVIEW By Gwen Willems, Ph.D.

Charles Jonas (1840-1896): Czech National Liberal, Wisconsin Bourbon Democrat. C. Winston Chrislock. Philadelphia: Balch Institute Press, 1993, 209 pages in libraries and used bookstores.

Charles Jonas (1840-1896): Czech National Liberal, Wisconsin Bourbon Democrat is a very thorough and dense biography by historian C. Winston Chrislock, a professor emeritus at the University of St. Thomas. The author's fine scholarship is reinforced with extensive notes and bibliography. Thanks to the Fulbright program, Chrislock lived in Czechoslovakia from 1986 to 1987, where he researched and read original source material regarding Charles Jonas.

During his academic career, Chrislock's research focused on recent Czech and Czechoslovak political and cultural history. He also examined Czech immigration to America, which he explored in a chapter for the encyclopedic source book, *They Chose Minnesota: A Survey of the State's Ethnic Groups*.

Charles Jonas was a Czech and American political leader, as well as a prolific author and editor. In the United States, he served as a state representative, state senator, and lieutenant governor in Wisconsin, and in Europe as an American consul.

The author organized the book into eight chronological sections. In the first section, "Bohemia (1840-1860)," Jonas spends his youth and childhood in Malešov, Bohemia, attends Prague Technical School, begins his journalism career, and is incarcerated for eight days and banished from Prague after participating in nationalistic festivities. In "London (1860-1863)," Jonas focuses his efforts on journalistic and political writing. In "Racine (1863-1870)," Jonas' journalism career flourished, when he becomes editor of the weekly Slavie, and he marries the daughter of the Slavie's co-owner. In "Europe (1870-1871)," Jonas is a Franco-Prussian War correspondent, visits Bohemia incognito, and publishes several books. In "Racine (1870s)," he continues his career as a journalist, linguist ethnic leader, and politician, where he is elected to the Wisconsin state assembly in 1877. "Racine and Prague (1880s)" sees him serving as Wisconsin state senator and later American consul to Prague. Back in "Wisconsin (Early 1890s)," Jonas becomes state lieutenant governor. În "St. Petersburg, Prague, Krefeld, Olšany (1894-96)," he is American consul general in St. Petersburg,

Prague, Krefeld (Germany), and Olšany. His continuing mental and physical deterioration leads to his suicide.

Chrislock investigates many pertinent themes in the book, such as women's rights, Czech nationalism, federalism, and mental health (Jonas was likely bipolar). The author's breadth of knowledge about history is helpful, as in this passage about the impact of historical events on Czech migration:

"The process of Czech migration to America began only after the 1848 revolutions, and then gained momentum after conclusion of the American Civil War (1865). The Austro-Hungarian Compromise of 1867, which brought about significant constitutional revisions including the right to emigrate, removed an obstacle that had stood in the way of Czech migration. Consequently, the trickle of Czech settlers to the United States in the 1850s became a steady flow in the late 1860s and early 1870s."
