Successful 30th Czech & Slovak Festival

We did it again! For the 30th year, Sokol Minnesota hosted a successful Czech & Slovak Festival at our historic C.S.P.S. Hall. As always, we shared our heritage, enjoyed performances, ate and drank, volunteered with friends, old and new, and raised important funds for our Hall.

Every area contributed, and Treasurer Don Haselbauer reported a net income of \$7,275. With no cover charge to the public, all of this income came from the wonderful food, beer, gift shop, kids' games, sponsors, and silent auction sales enjoyed by the crowd. All of our hard-working volunteers contributed to our success, but special kudos to our area leaders (see October *Slovo*, and in bold below). Thanks to all of our volunteers and guests!

Again, the food was fantastic- authentic *Segedinský guláš* (goulash) and chicken *paprikáš*, *jitrnice* (sausage), pork burgers, hot dogs, and the ever-popular *halušky* a *kapusta* (dumpling, cabbage, and bacon hot dish). This year we added a vegetable salad for the vegetarians and vegans in our crowd. Czech beer and cold beverages, tasty desserts and koláče, and Coldstone ice cream rounded out the menu. Special thanks to Martina Gurgel and helpers from the Czech & Slovak School Twin Cities for the lovely *perničky* (decorated gingerbread cookies) and sweets, and Jan Roers and Cinnamon Whaley for their donated treats.

For this Festival, we had two special exhibits on loan from National Czech and Slovak Museum and Library in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. The third floor featured the *Leaving Czechoslovakia* exhibit. Visitors could read and hear pre-recorded stories of 20th-century immigrants who fled communist Czechoslovakia, as well as see several personal artifacts of Sokol members on display. Visitors also had a chance to place a pin on a map of then Czechoslovakia to show where their ancestors are from. As the festival progressed, the map (*continued on pg. 4*)

(continued from pg. 3) filled out nicely and the final result showed that in our Czech and Slovak community we have ties to all corners of the Czech and Slovak lands. The third-floor experience would not be complete without a few lighthearted games such as trying to recognize typical Czech or Slovak objects placed into a large bag by just feeling them (for example, an Easter ratchet). It proved to be much harder than needing water supply. Everyone felt one would think! And once again, for the smallest of visitors, we had a Children's Czech Cartoon Corner, where this year we showed a popular, slapstick animation of Pat a Mat.

The first-floor exhibit Sokol Through the Years paid homage to the creation of Sokol, which started in the mid-19th century in Prague and soon afterwards came to the United States. The exhibit recounted perilous times throughout Czechoslovak history when Sokol was banned by various oppressive governments, the development of spartakiáda (gymnastic events) during communist years, and how a nation of immigrants across the ocean used Sokol to help build strong American communities. Highlights of the September Board of Director Meeting By Denise Stibal

The September 19 Sokol Minnesota Board of Directors meeting was held in our newly furnished and re-decorated classroom, with food provided by Pat Slaber and Blanka Brichta. Happy 70th Birthday was sung to Don Haselbauer (*Živijó*, *Živijó*, *Živijó*).

We will have a visit from Czech Author Renáta Fučíková, with a program at the C.S.P.S. Hall on September 29. The Czech Consul General in Chicago, Jaroslav Kantůrek, and the head of the Chicago Trade and Economics Section, Consul Tomáš Trnka, will visit, with a reception on October 22 at the American Swedish Institute.

Ed Hamernik reported that most of our planned exterior work is completed and all scheduled interior structural repair projects should be completed by mid-November.

Mary Cahill reported that the new gymnastics equipment has arrived and class enrollment is at capacity. The Western District gymnastics competition will be April 18, 2020, in Cedar Rapids, along with the annual meeting. Planning for the 2021 Slet in Chicago is underway.

Pat Slaber reported on the classroom updates, with language classes beginning this week and a *Koláče* making class on November 9. Thank you to Blanka Brichta, Pat Slaber, Gary Zweber, and everyone else who volunteered for the updates on the classroom, including new tables, chairs, cabinets, shelves, and painting. Ed Hamernik submitted the August and October gaming budgets, which were approved, and Don Haselbauer submitted the monthly treasurer's report. Summer Taneční Lessons by Sally Sebek



Taneční (dance) lessons in the area of the Czech Republic have evolved over the years, but the idea has stayed the same: learning to dance. In the 1800s, upper-class parents followed the tradition of the nobility by having their children learn dance, as well as etiquette, from professional teachers. The demand for teaching the new polka dance and rigorous tests of all other dances supplied the Czech lands with highly qualified teachers. The tradition of dance and etiquette lessons continued throughout the centuries and is just as strong as when it first started.

For me, the dance lessons were a really special experience. I arrived at the dance hall in my grandparents' town knowing my two friends only, but they introduced me to their school friends,

making it very easy for me to blend right in with the group. The dance lessons were an ideal opportunity to make more friends. Not only was the actual dancing a great time for bonding and socializing, but so were the promenades in between and the regular late evening gatherings afterwards. Once we became acquainted, I was automatically welcomed, making it the most amusing and enjoyable month of the summer.

Every dance lesson was different--from learning waltz, foxtrot, or jive, to socializing in Czech, but there was always a routine that went like this. Starting at 6 p.m., 40 girls in summer dresses and 40 boys in suits and white gloves lined up on either side of the community dance hall, waiting for the dance teachers to show up. The live band announced and welcomed the teachers with their familiar tune. The teachers gave a quick warmup speech and started the lesson. The music was fun, prompting us to dance a *valčík* (waltz variation) to the Beatles! Every class we learned new dances (15 dances in all) or enhanced the easy ones, adding new spins and hand gestures. Every two dances, the boys returned the girls, thanked them, and found a new girl to dance with. Occasionally it was "girls' choice". The dance classes took place three times a week for the entire month.


On Tuesdays, special lessons took place. These were extended lessons in which dance alumni could come and practice their dancing, as could the parents. During these lessons, we did not learn anything new, we just polished the steps we had previously learned and enjoyed the time dancing with our parents and friends. These lessons were my favorite, partly because we had the chance to dress up and win prizes for the most creative costumes.

To culminate our dance lesson series, we had a final dance. The boys asked out the girls, bought them bouquets of flowers, and all the girls wore beautiful white gowns. It was truly a magical experience. We danced all night, showed off our new dancing skills, posed for photos, gave each other presents, exchanged phone numbers, and created connections and unforgettable memories.
