Hall in Saint Paul, as part of their summer vacation spent in the Czech-speaking town of Spillville, Iowa, which provided a welcomed respite from his work at the National Conservatory of Music in New York City. Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota, whose home is the same 1887 C.S.P.S. Hall, celebrates the 130th anniversary of Antonín Dvořák's visit with a Sunday afternoon filled with music by the world-famous maestro on Sunday, September 17.

Meet Our Teachers

Tess Dajc (online Advanced Beginning Czech)

was born in Kolín, Czech Republic. She has been teaching Czech for ten years. In her spare time, she likes to write poetry and was recently published in several literary journals.

George Hoffman (online Slovak)

has studied Slovak for about 12 years, and has taught it for two years. He has a Ph.D. in Classical Languages and taught Ancient Greek and Latin in college in the 1970's, after which he went to work for the Minnesota Department of Human Services. George's maternal grandparents were both Slovaks from the Námestovo area, who immigrated to the United States in 1903



and lived in Chicago. He has been to Slovakia twice, in 2015 and 2017, and visited Námestovo.

Luboš Mareš

(in-person Advanced Beginning Czech)

was born in the Czech Republic in the small town of Milevsko. He studied at the Central School of Engineering (SPSS) in Tabor and ended his educational journey in Prague at Czech Technical University (CVUT). He has been living in Minnesota for 23 years. Luboš is a teacher of Kung Fu, Tai Chi, Qigong, and Mindfulness. Teaching Czech language gives Luboš the opportunity to bring the Czech Republic closer to our hearts.

Renáta Tichá, PhD (online Advanced Czech)

has been teaching advanced Czech at Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota for the last eight years. She is originally from the Czech Republic and enjoys supporting Czech learners in Minnesota on their Czech language journeys, including for preserving their Czech heritage, speaking Czech with their family, or wanting to study or work in the Czech Republic. She is a research faculty in special education



Michael Trittipo

(in-person Beginning Czech) studied second-language teaching theory and methods at the University of Minnesota (for teaching English as a Second Language) and the Defense Language Institute (DLI, where he taught French 2019-2020). The DLI is where he first learned Czech as a soldier during the Cold War, with zero background. (You can learn it as an adult, too!) He maintains it



with reading and listening, and occasional months at one of the Czech "summer schools," where he follows a "no-English" rule. He looks forward to helping you begin to learn this wonderful language.

Tai Chi and Kung Fu at Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota

Kung Fu: Wednesdays 6-7 p.m Tai Chi: Wednesdays 7-8 p.m. The classes at Sokol Minnesota's C.S.P.S. Hall are continuous, so you can join at any time! Fee: \$40/month. Family discounts are available

What is Tai Chi?

Tai Chi is famous for its slow, meditative movements and health benefits, including reducing stress, increasing balance, and strengthening legs and core. This is an ideal class for adults and seniors.

What is Kung Fu?

Kung fu is a blanket term for martial arts originating in China. If you have seen movies starring Jacky Chan, Jet Li, Donnie Yen, or Michelle Yoeh, then you have seen Kung Fu. This is a more active class than Tai Chi, with more vigorous movements. The class is ideal for children (6 and up) and adults.

Who will be teaching?

John Allen, 5th degree black sash, master level, American Kung Fu. Sifu (master) Allen's interest in Kung Fu started in watching the television show in the 70's. He started classes in college, first in Tae Kwan Do, but later studied Ho Chin Po, Mitzon Lohan, and Yang style Tai Chi before joining American Kung Fu in December of 1999. Mr. Allen is a research scientist at Honeywell.

Luboš Mareš, 1st degree black sash, instructor level, American Kung Fu. Mareš started Karate when he was 12. It was the only martial arts available in his home town of Milevsko, Czech Republic. After a couple of years, he started exploring different styles of martial arts including Ninjutsu, Kickboxing, Thai Boxing, Judo, and finally Kung Fu. Mr. Mareš has been with American Kung Fu for over eight years. He has been a mechanical engineer at Promet Optics for 23 years.



Caravans in the Dark Book Launch and Literary Ventures Discussion

A book launch party for *Caravans in the Dark*, a World War II historical novel by Bonnie Oldre, was held at Open Book in Minneapolis on July 16, 2023. Bonnie is a retired librarian and a member of Literary Ventures, a book club cosponsored by the Czech and Slovak Cultural Center of Minnesota, Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota, and the Honorary Consulate of the Czech Republic/Minneapolis. Bonnie was congratulated by fellow Literary Ventures members, members of her large Czech heritage family, and other friends and relatives. Ken Janda, another member of Literary Ventures and author of *The Emperor and the Peasant*, spoke first about events that led up to the creation of Czechoslovakia and some of the ethnic rivalries that shaped the time period that is the setting of Bonnie's novel. Bonnie recounted her years researching and writing the book, as well as the themes in the book, and read selections.

Caravans in the Dark is set in Czechoslovakia in 1938-1939,

during the Nazi invasion and occupation. The book's events are seen through the eyes of Jana, a 15-year-old Romani girl, who becomes a freedom fighter after she gets a job at Prague castle, where she smuggles out secret messages, which are hidden inside of clocks, to the Resistance.

Author Peter Geye says this book is "...everything historical fiction ought to be. At once fascinating in its detail, epic in scope, and impossibly rich... a novel fairly bursting with characters to fall in love with." Author Linda Kass states it is "Deeply researched and tenderly rendered."

As Literary Ventures' first book of the 2023/2024 season, Bonnie will discuss *Caravans in the Dark* on Saturday, September 30 from 10 a.m. to noon at the C.S.P.S. Hall.

Highlights of the Sokol Minnesota Board of Directors July 2023 Meeting By Theresa Hudachek

The Czech and Slovak Sokol Minnesota Board of Directors July 2023 meeting was called to order by President Cinnamon Whaley on July 20 at 7 p.m.

Discussion:

The possibility of a *Vit Hořejš* Czech Marionette performance of "Czech & Slovak Fairy Tales With Strings" in early- or mid-September was discussed. Because we already have many events scheduled in September, information on this will be passed on to Jitka Sebek with Czech & Slovak School Twin Cities.

The Slovak-centered dance group *Holubica* is requesting a meeting with the Board in August or September. Lucy Rose will reach out to Karin from the dance group to get more specific details about their hope for a formal relationship with Sokol Minnesota.

Savanna Larson emailed asking if we are open to implementing a music program alongside the dance program. She may be interested in joining Sokol Minnesota and collaborating on projects to promote Czech and Slovak music. Steve Ernest is going to reach out to Savanna to learn more about her interest in a music program.

A local "Run of the Republic" 5K Fun Run in support of the annual Sokol world-wide commemoration of the founding of the Czechoslovak Republic on October 28, 1918, has generated minimal interest in response to ads, so it may not happen here this year. See the ad on page 7.

Reports:

Education: The complete class schedule and a "Meet Our Teachers" page should be on the website by August 1. Registration will open in late August.

Rental Committee: Denise Stibal noted there are two bookings for July, three bookings for August, and two bookings for September.

Plans for the Dvořák Visit Anniversary Celebration on September 17 were reviewed.

A \$250 donation was received from Czechoslovak Genealogical Society International.

The possibility of distributing the metal folding chairs (that have been replaced) to three interested Sokol Minnesota members was discussed. The rental committee was asked to report back to the Board regarding any possible use or need for keeping the metal chairs. The idea was discussed of not selling bottled spring water at events, and instead, promoting using the water refill station to refill personal bottles; a decision was not made.

Finance Committee: Chair Joyce Tesarek led discussion regarding a possible Sokol Minnesota credit card for use for Sokol Minnesota purchases.

Membership: Director Steve Ernest presented the Sokol Minnesota Membership Report for July 2023. New member applications for Patti Arntz of Savage and Lynette O'Leary of Saint Paul were approved. The current membership is 298.

Board of Instructors: Directors Mary Cahill and Jason Brozovich reported Courtney Benson is unable to continue as head female instructor. They are working with her on a transition period to allow time to find a new instructor. Gymnastics classes to resume September 11. No increase in class fees from last year; hoping to increase class sizes. Working on updating the Fitness page on website. We appreciate Mary Kucera's and Richard Sargent's help with this. We are trying to think "outside the box" with mat storage and easy setup/removal; may enlist the help of Building and Property Trustees Committee for ideas. Decided on mats that can be removed/relocated from stage closet to allow for more space for dance and rental items.

Kung Fu teachers are combining age groups for Kung Fu and adding a Tai Chi class; classes on Wednesday evenings.

Building and Property Trustees Committee: Chair Bob Kotek noted the parking lot repaving and lighting projects have been completed. The beer cooler will be picked up and installed next Monday.

Sound-proofing materials for the first floor classroom are estimated to cost \$1800. Looking for a contractor to do this work in a timely manner.

Pursuing bids to install a fence between the parking lot and the building to the west.

A motion was approved to pursue a grant for more building planning.

Gaming Chair Ed Hamernik. The expense budget for August 2023 and the actual operation summary for June were approved.

Treasurer Don Haselbauer's report noted the account balances.

Meeting adjourned.

Another Beautiful Book by Peter Sís

The Conference of the Birds by Peter Sís. Penguin Press: New York, 2013, 160 pages. Available at libraries and bookstores.

The Conference of the Birds is the first book for adults by Peter Sís, the Czech-American, world-renowned children's book author and illustrator.

As long as he can remember, Sís loved to draw pictures of flying—which symbolized freedom and birds. This includes all kinds of birds: human-face birds, fish birds, snake birds. Illustrating "The story of Simorgh" in Jorge Luis Borges's *Book of Imaginary Things* led him to read the translation of the original *The Conference of the Birds*. Dating to 1177, the original was written by the Persian Sufi poet Farid ud-Din Attar, who was educated as a theologian and traveled widely to Egypt, Damascus, Mecca, Turkestan, and more. After reading Sís' shorter adaptation of the storyline, you might be inspired to enhance your experience by reading a full translation of the original.

Sis' rendition of the story begins with all the birds of the world getting together for a conference. Each of them represents a human fault which prevents humankind from attaining enlightenment. The hoopoe bird, a symbol of virtue in Persia, tells them of concerns similar to those in today's world: "Birds! Look at the troubles happening in our world! Anarchy-discontent-upheaval! Desperate fights over territory, water, and food! Poisoned air! Unhappiness! I fear we are lost. We must do something! I've seen the world. I know many secrets. Listen to me: I know of a king who has all the answers. We must go and find him." The birds begin an epic and perilous journey over deserts, mountains, oceans, and seven valleys (of quest, love, understanding, detachment, unity, amazement, and death).

In the Valley of Detachment, the philosophical and lyrically poetic nature of the work comes through. Sís wrote, "The astrologer bird traces all the constellations and planets on his tablet of sand. Then the wind picks up . . . and scatters his design to dust. How solid is our world . . . and yet it is nothing but grains of sand." After a long and dangerous quest, the birds have dwindled. "A band of thirty battered, beaten, beleaguered companions ... hardly able to fly" come to the Mountain of Kaf. They reach their king at last, finding that they are Simorgh the King, for Simorgh means thirty birds in Persian. Simorgh the King is each of them and all of them. In this story, Sis has shown us the beauty and the pain of the human journey.



By looking within, we find guidance, sustenance, and wisdom.

Sís' intricate and detailed illustrations are outstanding. He does delightful things with groups of birds, one large bird formed of many, patterns and shading composed of numerous birds, sometimes birds in one color and other times in full color. There are mazes throughout the book, to be solved if and when the reader chooses. Textured paper underlying the remarkable watercolor and pin-point illustrations adds to the reader's sensory experience.

Peter Sís is the author/illustrator of more than twenty books. I especially enjoyed his books set in the Czech lands—*The Three Golden Keys* (1994); *The Wall: Growing Up Behind the Iron Curtain* (2007); *Nicky & Vera: A Quiet Hero of the Holocaust and the Children He Rescued* (2021); and his *Madlenka* titles. Sís also produced several books focused on influential men: Christopher Columbus, Charles Darwin, Galileo Galilei, and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

His honors are numerous. Sís is the first children's book artist to be named a MacArthur Fellow. He won the Hans Christian Andersen Award, The New York Times Book Review Best Illustrated Book of the Year award seven times, the American Library Association's Caldecott Honor three times, the Boston Globe–Horn Book Award four times, and the Robert Silbert Medal. He was born in Brno, Czechoslovakia in 1949, grew up in Prague, and studied painting and filmmaking at the Academy of Applied Arts in Prague and the Royal College of Art in London. He came to the United States in 1982.

The winning combination of art and story that Sis presents in *The Conference of the Birds* makes me hope he'll offer more books for adults in the future.
